Seminar in Language Teaching Issues

Contents:

The course covers a range of objectives and encompasses a wide range of materials which are initially aimed at familiarizing the candidates with, and refreshing them on, various areas of interest and will lead them to choose their own areas. In the course, they will receive guidance to select and produce their research topic/s in TEFL/applied linguistics. Not only will they will get acquainted with the nature, processes, methods and procedures of doing critical studies, they will also take the first steps in writing their research proposals.

Objectives:

by the end of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Understand the nature, process, principles of critical studies in applied linguistics;
- 2. Get critical insight with respect to any piece of materials;
- 3. Develop a general understanding of how to explore research point/s from the materials they read;
- 4. Consolidate research-oriented perspectives in themselves;
- 5. Select a research topic amenable to study with an eye to develop it as a thesis project;
- 6. Gain the ability to write sample research proposals

- C. Study a sample MA thesis and render an evaluation report
